Digital Government Pillars

3 pillars: openness and commitment - governance and coordination - capabilities to support implementation

Openness and Commitment

- Openness, transparency and inclusion
- Commitment and participation in policy making and service delivery
- · Building a data-driven culture

Governance and Coordination

- Adoption by senior management
- Use of digital technology in various sectors
- Effective organizational structure and proper governance

Support Capacity

- Institutional Capacity Building
- Digital technology acquisition
- Legal and Regulatory Framework

Digital Government Transformation: Globally and regionally

Globally

- Many countries are progressing for e-government from 2020 to 2022
- Increased number of countries that obtained a very high or high value according to the F-Government Development Index (FGDI)
- Decreas

Role of ESCWA: promoting government digital transformation in the Arab region providing tools that support decision-making

Regionally

- Average EGDI values are lower than the global average
- The Arab region has not changed its overall ranking
- Slight improvement in the overall value of the indicator



Government Electronic and Mobile Service (GEMS) Maturity Index - Objectives


Index: important tool to support policy makers in the Arab region to develop and improve digital government services

Focus on:


- Services availability and sophistication (supply)
- Service usage and user satisfaction (demand)
- Public outreach (inclusion)
- 14 sectors (education, health, transport, ...)




GEMS22: Regional Performance Overall Scores




GEMS22: Regional Performance Service Availability and Sophistication




GEMS22: Regional Performance **Service Usage and Satisfaction**




GEMS22: Regional Performance Public outreach

Index Simulator for Policymakers in the Arab Region (ISPAR)

- Provide Information on current performance for a specific country (rank/score)
- Compare national performance with other countries (inside/outside the region)
 - Simulate the impact of any change on performance (globally or by theme/sector)
- Tool to prioritize the needed intervention





Improving policymaking effectiveness

Many Arab countries face difficulties in collecting and producing information about the state of the economy. More coherence is needed within and across priorities and a broader national commitment towards implementation of reforms.

The Index Simulator for Policymakers in the Arab Region (ISPAR) serves as an easy-to-use tool to test the potential impact of specific policies on national ranking against selected international indicators.

Maturity

- 4 maturity groups: VH, H, M, and Early maturity groups
- Need to support countries in early maturity stage by exchanging experiences between Arab countries

Pillars

- Acceptable: Availability of services over portals, channel security
- More efforts are needed for service usage and satisfaction
- Areas to improve: digital accessibility, mobile apps, seamless operations
